If AEG isn't able to get an NFL franchise to commit to LA by Oct. 17th of this year, the City is committed to a "Plan B", and that is to expand the South Hall with contiguous exhibit space, add a large ballroom and additional meeting rooms, in addition to upgrading the West Hall and adjacent meeting space. And the LACC City Department is working with developers to add the hotel room inventory needed to accommodate larger groups and for Los Angeles to become a first tier convention, tradeshow and special event City. I truly believe it is an exciting time to be in Los Angeles and to be a part of the Los Angeles Convention Center. The best is yet to come and amazing things lie ahead. And you all will be a part of it.

Events Update

ASCD 2014 – On March 12-18, 2014, the LACC welcomed 10,000 members of ASCD (formerly the Association of School Curriculum and Development). Attendees included school administrators, teachers, school district members and education professionals from all over the US and around the world. This citywide convention generated nearly 20,000 total hotel room nights, representing over \$26M in economic impact to the City of Los Angeles.

Earth Day at LACC

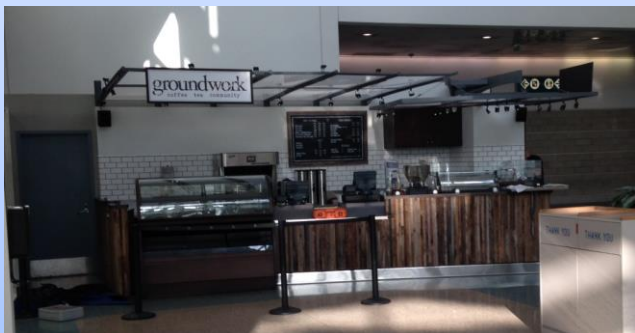

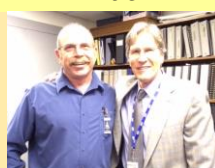
